The Chrismon Tree

This month, look for the Chrismon Tree in the Sanctuary with ornaments made by many members of JMPC. What is a Chrismon Tree? In 1957, Francis Kipps Spencer created the first Chrismon tree. She coined the term Chrismon as a combination of Christ + monogram to reflect her desire to create decorations for a Christmas tree that "proclaim the name, the life, and the saving acts of Jesus Christ." The purpose was to make homemade ornaments to show central symbols of the Christian faith.
