We encourage online participation since information will go directly to HOLY COW without having to be entered by someone else. There will be a short turn-around time of 3 -4 weeks so that we can compile the information and let HOLY COW do their interpretation. Once that is complete, we will be

scheduling a time for the report to be presented to the congregation.

Watch your email and Constant Contact emails for more information. The survey results will be used by the PNC to help develop their Ministry Information Form to begin their search. Prospective pastors will use this as a guide to see if their talents, interests, and type of ministry is a good fit with JMPC.


Duquesne Kids Klub Needs YOU!

As we sit in front of our garden planning paperwork and seed catalogs looking forward with hope to the warmer days ahead, I want to take this opportunity to thank you and your volunteers for your hard work through the 2024 growing season! The SHIM Community Gardens Program continues to thrive with the support of the 14 gardens in our growing network, as well as the community businesses and organizations that we have built strong relationships with since

the inception of the program in 2012.

The 2024 growing season was very successful – a total of 17,608 pounds of produce was distributed through our 3 food pantries!

You, along with your dedicated team of volunteers at John McMillan Church help the SHIM garden program to achieve each of the benchmarks set forth in our mission statement:

'SHIM's mission is to mobilize community resources and implement sustainable programs that compassionately help our neighbors

meet basic needs, achieve self-sufficiency and build community.'

"mobilize community resources" = John McMillan's leadership allows a portion of available land to be utilized for the garden. Your parishioners support the program through donations, seed starting, volunteering and countless other garden tasks.

sufficiency" = John McMillan volunteers grow healthy produce for our clients to include in their diets, meeting one of the most important basic needs – nutritious food choices. Without access to a healthy diet, one's physical and

2024-2025 Preschool Registration Opens Wednesday, February 3, 2025!

It is time for Preschool Registration at John McMillan.
We are excited to offer the following Preschool classes for the 2025-2026 school year:

Pre-Kindergarten AM or PM: For children age $4\frac{1}{2}$ as of September 30, 2025, this class meets Monday-Thursday and fosters the development of specific skills that are essential for success in kindergarten. Each day will include free play and gross motor time.

4-Year Olds AM or PM: For children age 4 as of September 30, 2025, this class meets three days per week and lessons are designed to prepare children for kindergarten. Each day includes free play and gross motor time.

3-Year Olds AM or PM: For children age 3 as of September 30, 2025, 2-day (Tuesday & Thursday) or 3-day (Monday, Wednesday, Thursday) classes are offered. Children must be toilet trained. The focus of our 3's curriculum is socialization and learning through play.

Young 3 Year Olds AM: For children turning age 3 June- Oct. 31, 2025, 2-day (Tuesday & Thursday) classes are offered. Children must be toilet trained. The focus of our 3's curriculum is socialization and learning through play.
