From Pastor Jeff

There are several things you can count on with the arrival of the fall season: the amount of daylight begins to shorten, leaves begin to fall, the Pirates go home for the winter, the Steelers make us smile or cringe, the Penguins give us hope, the kids go back to school, *and the annual Stewardship Campaign at John McMillan Presbyterian Church takes place.*

And so it is ...

It is time to commit financially to the mission and ministry of your church. While it might seem like we are simply asking for money, that is not quite true. Consider this. I read something a while back that I found profound. Interestingly, it involved prayer, not stewardship. It was a podcast of an interview of Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel by Carl Stern. The subject of prayer came up and this was the exchange.

Carl Stern: *That raises the question, though — if you're saying that if God were to control every aspect of [someone's] life, it would not be living, then that raises the question, why pray to God, then? If God is not going to interfere, if God is not going to intervene, if God is not going to help, what is the role of prayer?*

Rabbi Heschel: *First of all, let us not misunderstand the nature of prayer, particularly in Jewish tradition. The primary purpose of prayer is not to make requests. The primary purpose of prayer is to praise, to sing, to chant, because the essence of prayer is a song, and [people] cannot live without a song. Prayer may not save us, but prayer may make us worthy of being saved. Prayer is not requesting. There is a partnership of God and [us]. God needs our help.*

As I was poised over my keyboard this morning thinking about what to say to you about stewardship, I could not get Heschel's comments about prayer out of my head. And I thought it spoke to what I was thinking about stewardship. So here is my re-write of Heschel's comments on prayer as applied to stewardship.

First of all, let us not misunderstand the nature of giving, particularly in the Judeo-Christian tradition. The primary purpose of giving is not to make budget. The primary purpose of giving is to praise, to sing, to chant, because the essence of giving is worship and mission, and people cannot live without worship and mission. Giving might not save us, but it might make us worthy of being saved. Giving is a partnership of God and God's people. God needs our help.

This has been our experience here at JMPC, hasn't it? We have formed a partnership with God to pursue God's will in the world. We have gathered our resources and invested them in helping God. And we have helped. What we are asking is that you invest some of your money into our partnership with God. In October you will be hearing more about this. You will also be receiving your estimate of giving card for 2024. Please consider how you will praise, sing, chant, worship and be a light to the world through your donations to JMPC. Come to worship and return the card on October 29, Consecration Sunday.

In partnership with God, we will change lives.
